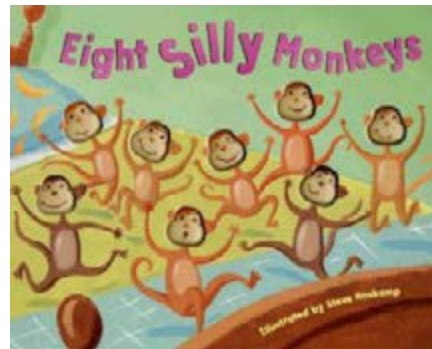




3, 4 and 5 years old

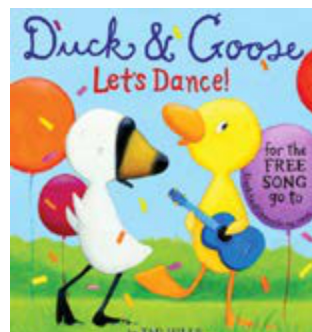
★ **Peace at Last**

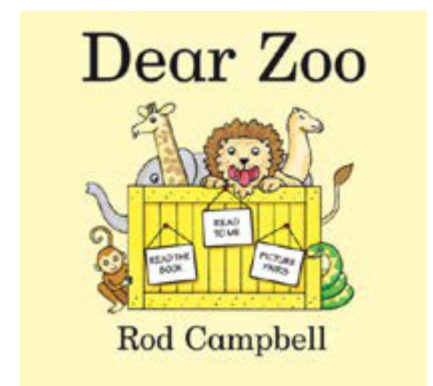


★ **Pete the Cat (series)**

Pete the Cat, star of the bestselling Pete the Cat book series. Pete the Cat and his adventures... Lots of laughs and engaging stories.

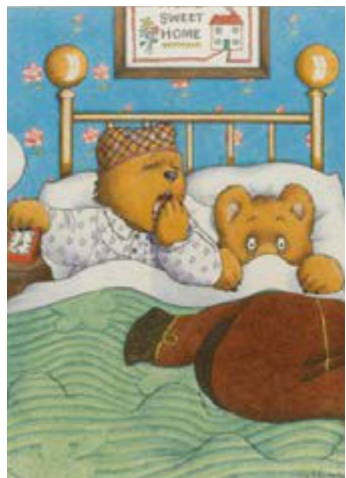
★ **Dear Zoo**

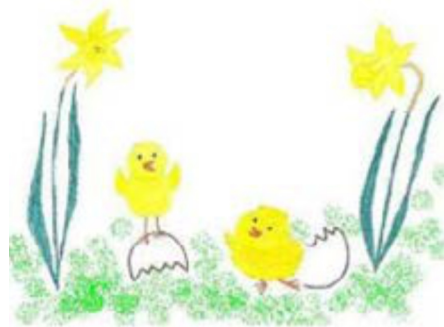


★ Peace at Last

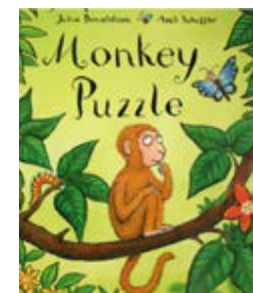
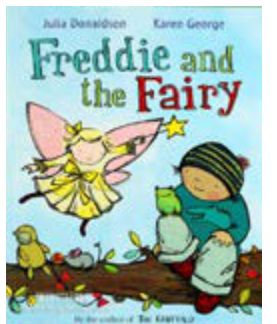


★ Danny the Dragon

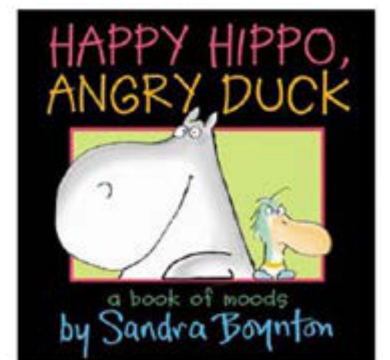


★ Monkey Puzzle

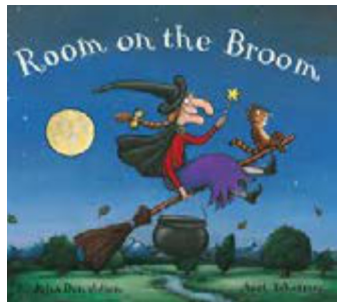
★ Happy Hippo Angry Duck
